MEC BHEKI CELE'S SPEECH AT SIYABAKHUMBULA IN VRYHEID ON

SUNDAY, 07-12-08.

The KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Transport, Community Safety and Liaison Mr. Bheki Cele

officiated Siyabakhumbula, a mass church service held in remembrance of those who were

killed in road accidents throughout the country. The service was held at Bhekuzulu Sports

Ground, Vryheid on Sunday, 7 December 2008.

In his address to the community that filled two marquees, the MEC said that although the

service was dedicated to remembering those who had died in vehicular accidents, it was

important that he warn people that are still alive to be safe on the road and stay alive. He

urged all parents to speak to their children about drinking and driving, as statistics show that

most people who fall victim to road accidents are young, fit and economically active people.

Cele singled out alcohol as the leading cause of road accidents. He said that he was

extremely disappointed that despite numerous warnings given out to the public about a road

block that was carried out in Florida Road, Durban, 58 people were arrested for drunken

He urged public transport drivers to be cautious on the road and treat their

passengers with respect and not as "loads", as they are people's mothers, fathers, sons and

daughters and their death would cause a lot of pain and suffering to those left behind.

Cele said that the new brake tester machine was also very effective in assisting to detect

unroad-worthy vehicles and was convenient as it was portable and could be carried to

wherever the road block was going to be conducted.

RTI STATISTICS FROM THE 1ST TO 5TH OF DECEMBER 2008.

Since the 1st of December 2008, 140 people have been arrested for drunken driving. There

have been 8 speed arrests and 743 speed charges (including camera). 362 People were

caught driving without a licence and 227 were charged for not wearing their seatbelts. 7 were

charged for inconsiderate driving.

Under Thathiskorokoro Operations conducted by Shanela 35 buses, 22 taxis and 8 metered

taxis have been impounded for road unworthiness. In total 156 vehicles have been

suspended.

"Have a wonderful festive season. Have as much fun as you want, but make sure that once

you are drunk you don't go anywhere near a vehicle or the road. To be safe rather stay at

home, ask somebody to drive you home or sleep where you are until you have sobered up.

Remember there is still life beyond the festive season and we would like to see you again in

2009 - alive and well," said Cele.
