Volunteer Social Crime Prevention Project (VSCPP) is a community-driven flagship project

that was unveiled by the honorable Mr. Bheki Cele last year in 2008. The volunteers were

volunteer programme has been a success. The work of volunteers is aimed at enhancing

the activities of social law enforcement and crime prevention agencies. These volunteers

have been trained in interviewing and statement taking skills, community development and

overall community engagement skills. This project has been given the thumbs-up by the

Premier Dr. Zweli Mkhize.

Transport will be provided in 19 local municipalities around the following district

municipalities; UThungulu, ILembe, UMzinyathi, Sisonke, and Zululand.

will then hand out certificates. This brings the total numbers of volunteers to 1850 many of

which are unemployed.
