CRIME STATISTICS REVEAL A DECREASE IN MOST CATEGORIES IN KZN

KZN MEC for Transport, Community Safety Mr. Willies Mchunu has welcomed the crime statistics

revealed for 2009/10 versus 2008/09. Crime statistics in KZN have shown that a number of

successes were achieved in combating crime. The three key categories of contact crime that

decreased include murder, attempted murder and robbery with aggravating circumstances. The

significant drop in the incidence of murder represents a highlight in this report.

Reports have shown that from 2008/09 to 2009/20, there has been a 14% decrease in murder

cases, making the Province the 2<sup>nd</sup> after North West, 3.3% decrease in sexual offences, 9.2%

decrease in attempted murder making KZN the leading Province in the decrease. Robbery with

aggravating circumstances showed a 13% decrease making the Province the 2<sup>nd</sup> after Northern

Cape. Stock-crime has increased by 2.1%. Robbery at non-residential premises has shown that

there was a 17% decrease making KZN the leading Province.

"I would like to congratulate the SAPS for their job-well done in reducing crime in KZN. Special

attention will be given to those areas that have increased e.g. Stock-theft. Furthermore, these

stats have shown that a social crime, which comprises all contact crime expect aggravating robbery

and common robbery are mainly crimes occurring between people who know one another (family,

friends, acquaintances etc). I would like to send a stern warning to all those who still break the law,

that the SAPS are out there in full force and they will face the full might of the law," said Mchunu.
