ITS ALL SYSTEMS GO FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTION - MCHUNU

KZN MEC for Transport, Community Safety and Liaison, Mr. Willies Mchunu is optimistic that the province will deliver peaceful, free and fair local government elections.

Mchunu said he is confident on the progress made by the province in changing the mindset of the people to respect other's rights and freedom of choice.
