industry and also monitor their behavior on the roads.

"I would like to emphasize that owning a drivers license is not a right but a privilege.

Drivers must know that when possessing a driver's license means you should adhere

with the rules of the road full stop. I will also submit a report to the cabinet and

legislature to seek theirs views and debate on ways to curb these accidents. We will

also engage with the Department of Justice in advocating for harsher sentences to road

offenders. I will be coordinating a meeting with all taxi drivers and truck drivers to
