MEC MCHUNU STRONGLY SUPPORTS CALL TO REDUCE SPEED LIMIT

MEC for Transport, Community Safety and Liaison Mr. Willies Mchunu strongly supports call to reduce speed limit from 120km/h to 100km/h by National Minister Sbu Ndebele which he announced yesterday (20/09/11) at the accident scene which occurred on the N2 that claimed

ten lives on Monday (19/09/11).

This call is subsequent to accidents that has been happening on KZN roads and killing many people. From the past three months till now, KZN continues to experience unacceptable gruesome accidents which cost many lives of innocent people who are economically active and

some who are breadwinners in their families.

Reports have shown that many accidents were human errors and especially fatigue and speed hence the call for speed reduction. Preliminary reports have shown that there is large number of increase in fatalities with a total of 1087 from 01/06 2011 to date and a total number of 535

crashes.

"This call by the National Minister came just after, I have instructed the Integrated Traffic Law Enforcement Committee to see if they can investigate possibilities, laws or legislation to reduce the speed limit on our roads. At this moment we as the government are forced to use any possible way to curb such accidents and to ensure that the citizens are safe at all times. This is why I fully support the Minister's call. I would also

Mchunu said it's high time that government begins to be tough and aggressive to road offenders.

He said the move by the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) to charge drivers who kills innocent people with murder and the reduction of speed limits, will go a long way in reducing fatalities and in changing the mindset of road users.
