KZN MEC for Transport, Community Safety and Liaison Mr Willies Mchunu said government is considering drastic measures to collect illegal firearms in the hands of civilians.

He was addressing thousands of Mankengane community in eShowe today (22 Novemner 2011).

tolerated. Today we are here to engage the community of Mangenganeni in a dialogue

regarding peace processes in this area.

We came here last year while tensions were rife in the area and tried to resolve them and

Mchunu appealed to traditional authorities to facilitate a ritual to unite the local community.

He also announced a team from the Department of Community Safety and Liaison to facilitate

interventions and work with the communities and the community structures to fight crime in the

area.
