MEC MCHUNU SENDS DELEGATION TO INTERVENE IN THE SYDENHAM POLITICAL

INTOLERANCE ISSUE

KZN MEC for Transport, Community Safety and Liaison Mr. Willies Mchunu has sent his delegation

from the Department of Community Safety to intervene in the Sydenham political intolerance issue

at a meeting held yesterday (28/07/2011) at Sydenham Police Station.

The discussions were held between ANC and IFP members, where a conflict arose between two

individuals. The meeting was dispersed due to the situation becoming unsafe in the area. It is

alleged that due to the disagreements there was destabilization in the area resulting in people

leaving their homes for safety reasons. Some shacks were demolished and some IFP members

sought safety at the police station. Cases were opened for malicious damage to property and arrests

were made. The discussion concluded by having IFP members taken back to their residences away

from the station. It was also resolved that people will be assisted with building material by

eThekwini council and there will be a further meeting to update the community with regards to the

developments in the area.

"People should not be chased away from their homes because of minor conflicts that can

be resolved verbally. It is true, sometimes people do not always see eye to eye but that

does not necessarily mean people must damage property and burn houses. We have

deployed police from the public order policing to ensure that people are safe and to

restore stability in the area," said Mchunu.
