NINE PEOPLE DIED AFTER A BUS AND TUCK COLLISION ON THE N3 NEAR ESTCOURT

MEC for Transport, Community Safety and Liaison Mr Willies Mchunu has express his sincere

condolences to the families of the nine victims killed in a horrific accident involving a truck and a

bus in the early hours of today (22/08/11) on the N3 Ultra City-Escourt.

According to preliminary reports received, the bus (Greyhound Coach Line) was travelling from

Mthatha to Gauteng, when a truck travelling on the South bound lost control and collided with a

bus. It is alleged that nine people died, seven were critically injured, 25 sustain serious injuries

and 23 sustained minor injuries and were taken to Estcourt and Ladysmith Hospital.

"I would like to send my deepest condolences to the bereaved families."

saddening that, more people continue to die everyday on our roads despites all the

efforts the government does to curb accidents on the roads. This accident happened

while the Province is still in mourning of two accidents that happened few weeks ago,

one claiming ten lives in Kokstad and another one on the N2 claiming eleven lives

including a nine month old baby. We continue to urge all drivers to adhere to all rules of

the road including taking care of their well being by resting, drinking water if they are

travelling long distances" said Mchunu.

The Department is going to intensify enforcement in KZN boarders for any vehicle entering or

exiting the province. The Department is also going to engage with other Provinces using KZN

roads to develop a coordinated plan of action to reduce carnages on the roads. Mchunu also continued that they will engage meet with the Bus, freight and taxi industries with an intension to see what kind of mechanism can be used to ensure safety on the roads.
