MEC NTULI TO LAUNCH CUTTING -EDGE TECHNOLOGY TO CURB FRAUDULENT ISSUING OF LICENCES AND TO ELIMINATE DEATHS ON THE ROAD

The KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Transport, Community Safety and Liaison, Bheki Ntuli, will launch a cutting-edge technology that will curb fraud and corruption in the licence testing centres in the province.

The launch of this innovative driver testing technology is part of intensifying the festive season safety plan and innovation to end road crashes. This will take place tomorrow, 3 December 2019.

Dubbed e-driver, this technology is part of the endeavours by the province to produce a new generation of drivers and will reduce backlog in driver testing centres.

As part of the heightened festive season safety plan and festive safety launch, MEC Ntuli, will attend amulti-disciplinary law enforcement operation, engage with commuters, inspect law enforcement parade and engage with both transport and community safety stakeholders.
