MEC KAUNDA URGES MOTORISTS TO BE CAUTIOUS ON THE ROADS DURING EASTER HOLIDAYS

The KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Transport, Community Safety and Liaison Mr Mxolisi Kaunda has urged motorists to be cautious on the roads as the Easter holidays approaches.

Kaunda urged motorists to abide by the rules of the roads all the time to save people from avoidable crashes. "As we are approaching the Easter weekend, the province is expecting a high volume of traffic on our major corridors, particularly the N3 and N2," said Kaunda.

The MEC also warned road users that the province has reignited its zero tolerance approach to lawlessness and that anyone who breaks the law will spend time in jail.

"Our law enforcement officers will be visible 24/7 on our roads ensuring that those who are found disobeying road rules are brought to book. We therefore warn road users that multi-disciplinary road blocks and road worthiness inspections will be conducted across the province.

We are also going to give special attention to drinking and driving, using of cellphones whilst driving, and over-speeding" said Kaunda.
