Inkosi Mhlabunzima Maphumulo House: We continue to record successful convictions of reckless motorists in various courts throughout the corners of the province.

Once again we express our deepest appreciation to the prosecutors deployed by the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA).

Their professional handling of cases brought by the Road Traffic Inspectorate and Shanela teams is a clear indication of an enduring partnership.

This partnership is critical in our execution of the #NenzaniLaEzweni operations.

In particular, we wish to cite prosecutors at Scottburgh Magistrates Court who continue to display a high level of efficiency.

We are proud of the fact that 98% of prosecuted cases brought by RTI Park Rynie have culminated in guilty verdicts.

Below are the latest cases, a classic example of professional evidentiary assessment, trial preparation, and courtroom competence: -

1. As per case 153/04/2026 accused Brian Rawthee has been sentenced to a fine of R20 000-00 or 2 years in prison for driving at 179 km/h.
2. As per case 137/06/2026 accused Nash Lee Govender has been sentenced to a fine of R15 000-00 or 10 months in prison for driving at 171 km/h
3. As per case 139/06/2026 accused Fanyana Makhanya has been sentenced to a fine of R10 000-00 or 8 months in prison for driving at 171 km/h

Critically, the excellent prosecutorial performance and high conviction rate for speeding and drunk driving cases cannot be divorced from an integrated approach involving NPA, South African Police Service, and the KZN Department of Health.

We will continue to work together to remove reckless motorists from our road networks.
