

More than 12 motorists earned themselves criminal records after their conviction for speeding and reckless driving: Duma says RTI Park Rynie is cleaning up our road networks

Inkosi Mhlabunzima Maphumulo House: We express our deepest gratitude to the Minister of Justice and Constitutional Development for assigning efficient and professional magistrates in Scottburgh Magistrates Court.

They are augmenting the work of our No Nonsense RTI Park Rynie team, which is executing the #NenzaniLaEzweni Operations with precision.

The conviction of more than 12 motorists for speeding and reckless driving is a clear indication of an integrated approach with the justice system. This integration is strengthening our road safety campaign.

Importantly, we wish to announce that Yusuf Ismail, who was arrested after fleeing from RTI and leaving behind his identity document, appeared in court yesterday. He was arrested for clocking 204 km/h in a 120 km/h zone.

He will reappear in court on the 18th of March for plea and sentencing.

He was traced and nabbed by RTI hiding at a golf estate on the South Coast.

This follows a meticulous investigation, which included the analysis of video footage and the use of advanced technology.

We have published, separately, a list of convicted motorists who have earned themselves criminal records. Some motorists had their licenses revoked—a clear message that possession of a driver's license is a privilege, not a constitutional right.

We are determined to clean up our more than 34,000 kilometers of road networks by removing reckless drivers.

RTI Teams across all corners of the province have joined forces with traffic officers in various municipalities following the meeting of the Integrated Traffic Law Enforcement Committee.

As we announced, we are focusing on rolling out #NenzaniLaEzweni Operations 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year.
