Inkosi Mhlabunzima Maphumulo House: As we are approaching the busy Easter holiday and Passover weekend, we are encouraged by the high level of firmness and no-nonsense approach as displayed by our highly efficient Road Traffic Inspectorate team.

We are projecting an increase in traffic volumes with an estimated figure of above 1500 to 2000 vehicles per hour passing through our tollgates starting from Thursday, 2nd April 2026

Over the past few days, many motorists have appeared in court following their arrests for drunk driving and excessive speeding.

To demonstrate that nobody is above the law, RTI is arresting any reckless motorists irrespective of their occupation and position in society.

Anyone who is caught on the wrong side of the law must not call us as we are busy.

In particular, the RTI Park Rynie is executing #NenzaniLaEzweni Operation with efficiency with motorists listed below having appeared in court:-

- Bhekumuzi Dube – a taxi owner was arrested for clocking 198 km/h and detained at SAPS Scottburgh – Cas 154/03/2026
- Thamsanqa Ntuli, a doctor, was arrested for clocking 170 km/h and detained at SAPS Hibberdene - Cas: 121/03/2026
- Vusi Tembe, an attorney, was arrested for clocking 170 km/h and detained at SAPS Scottburgh - Cas: 155/03/2026
- Senzeni Dlamini, a Compliance Operation Officer, was arrested for clocking 174 km/h and detained at SAPS Hibberdene - Cas: 123/03/2026
- Khaya Sidukwana, a teacher, was arrested for clocking 179 km/h and detained at SAPS Scottburgh - Cas: 165/03/2026
- Mondli Mnguni, SARS Tax Practitioner, was arrested for clocking 180 km/h and detained at SAPS Scottburgh - Cas: 167/03/2026
- Wandile Mahlambi, who is self-employed, was arrested for clocking 175 km/h and detained at SAPS Scottburgh - Cas: 152/03/2026
- Lihle Cele, a driver, was arrested for clocking 165 km/h and for drunk driving. He was detained at SAPS Scottburgh – Cas: 169/03/2026
- A female motorist, who is yet to appear in court, has been arrested for clocking 182 km/h and for drunk driving. She was detained at SAPS Scottburgh - Cas: 172/03/2026
