Akusiyena kuphela kodwa bakhona nabanye abaholi abanohlonze abakhiqizwa khona la eClermont.

As we celebrate our 20 years of freedom and democracy, let us remember all our heroes and heroines. As we are gathered here, we also note that the provincial Freedom Flame is being presented in Inanda – ekhaya lika Mongameli wokuqala ka Khongolose, u Dr. John Langalibalele Dube. Sizokhumbula futhi ukuthi ubaba u-Nelson Mandela, owaba nguMongameli wokuqala eNingizimu Afrika ekhululekile, wavotela khona le eNanda.

Ngayo i-Freedom Flame – eseyedlulile lapha e Clermont -- uHulumeni wesifunda uhlose ukuthi abantu bakithi babhiyozele intuthuko esilethiwe emiphakathini.

Mukhulu kakhulu umsebenzi esiwenzile njengoHulumeni ka-ANC ngenhloso yokushintsha izimpilo zabantu.

Namhlanje abantu abangu **16-million** bahlinzekwa ngemali yesibonelelo. Lemali isize kakhulu ukuxosha indlala emakhaya. KwaZulu-Natali badlula u-**3.7 million** abahlomula kulemali.

Ngaphansi kwalo Hulumeni waKwaZulu-Natali, sekube nokwenyuka ngo-80% kwezikole okufundwa kuzo mahhala neziphakela abafundi ababalelwa ku-2.1 million ukudla okunempilo khona ezikoleni.

Isibalo sezikole okufundwa mahhala senyuke safinyelela ku-4 739 ngonyaka odlule ka-2013, ezikoleni zomphakathi ezingu-6 009 esifundazweni.

Lolu hlelo luhambisana nokuzibophezela kukaHulumeni ukulwa nendlala nobubha emiphakathini ebonakala intula kakhulu.

Lapha KwaZulu-Natali sikwazile ukwenza ngcono imiphumela ka-Grade 12 isuka ku-57.8% eminyakeni emihlanu edlule yafinyelela ku-77.4% ngonyaka odlule ka-2013.

Uma ubheka ukuhlinzekwa ngogesi, sithola ukuthi isifunda sakithi siyaqhakaza kakhulu njengoba u-80% wezakhamuzi zihlala emizini ekhanyayo.

Kanjalo namanzi nokuthuthwa kwendle sekungenile kweminingi imiphakathi.

Kafushane nje, ngiphakamisa lezizinhlelo ukuqhakambisa ukuthi impela i-KwaZulu-Natal isiyindawo engcono kunangaphambi kuka-1994! KwaZulu-Natal is indeed a better place to live than in 1994.

But today we are here to officially launch the Provincial 2014 Easter Road Safety campaign to ensure safety on our roads during this period – and beyond.

During the Easter holidays, we usually see a lot of citizens travelling to many destinations including areas of worship and churches to celebrate this important religious period in the Christian calendar.

As the province of KwaZulu-Natal, we anticipate another busy Easter weekend – and an increase in traffic volumes starting from Thursday, the 17th until the 21st of April 2014.

While this is a period for us to receive blessings, to renew our spirits and enjoy quality time with our loved ones, we urge all to remain at their most vigilant on the road.

In the year of celebrating our 20 years of freedom and democracy, let us all commit ourselves to playing our part in stopping road carnages. Road safety is a collective responsibility. This means we must all say no to bad behaviour – including the following:

- We must say "no" to drinking and driving;
- We must say "no" to un-roadworthy vehicles;
- We must say "no" to impatience on the road;
- We must say "no" to road rage; and
- We must say "no" to driving long distances without rest.

At the same time, we must all agree that life is God's greatest gift to man. Life is precious. Because it is precious, then we must all value it and thereby honour God's wishes. And this starts by saying "yes" to many things – including:

- Strictly observing road traffic rules at all times;
- Fastening seatbelts every time;
- Giving right of way, whenever necessary;
- Reporting irresponsible driving behaviour; and
- Licensed and experienced drivers.

Our intensified law enforcement campaigns over this period will run over four phases. This includes:

- The Freedom Day Long Weekend of the 25-28 April 2014 right up until Workers day on 1st May 2014.
- A total of **792 traffic officers** will be strategically deployed to problematic or high traffic volume areas.
- The integration with other law enforcement services will also heighten our visibility and presence on the road. These include the South African Police Service, Customs, Cross-Border and Immigration forces, as well as metro and local municipality police.

Every traffic station will ensure that there is a vehicle check points in all areas of the province to root out irresponsible behavior from our roads.

This community of Clermont knows too well the devastation and the negative impact that fatal road accidents cause. We all will remember the unfortunate accident that occurred last year September 5th – when a truck crashed into taxis and claimed the lives of 24 innocent people off M-13, in Pinetown.

Ngokubambisana asiqhubeke sithuthukise izwe lakithi ukuze liye phambili.
