The Province of KwaZulu-Natal, Department of Transport, invites tenders, experienced in Engineering, Procurement and Construction (EPC) for this road infrastructure project. This is a **REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR ENGINEERING, PROCUREMENT AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE UPGRADE OF P258 FROM KM 13.4 - KM 23.4 IN THE EMPANGENI REGION**. This project is in the province of KwaZulu-Natal in the district municipality of DC26 (Zululand District) and local municipality of Abaqulusi. The duration of the project is 48 months inclusive of design and construction works. The successful bidder will be responsible for the design, procurement and construction of this project.

It is estimated that tenderers must have a CIDB contractor grading designation 9CE. Coupled to this, the professional engineering consultant is to demonstrate adequate experience of managing projects of a grade 9CE.

Only tenderers who comply with the functionality criteria for experience of key persons, company past performance in similar projects, and proposed approach and methodology, as stated in the Tender Data, are eligible to be considered for further evaluation.

Only locally produced or locally manufactured goods with a stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content as stated in the Tender Data will be considered. Failure to meet the minimum threshold for local production and content **will** lead to disqualification.

The successful tenderer must subcontract a minimum of 35% of the value of the contract to Targeted Enterprises through Contract Participation Goals (CPG) for the bidder, and subcontract a minimum of 35% of the value of Engineering Works to a BEE Level 1 EME or QSE that is more than 51% owned by black persons.

Tenderers shall be required to demonstrate that they will have in their employ during the contract period the necessary personnel satisfying the requirements of the Scope of Work for labour-intensive competencies for management and supervisory personnel.

Tender documents will be available as from 24th of May 2021 till 08th June 2021 from 08h00 till 15h30 during working hours (until the day prior to the Clarification Meeting). THE NATIONAL INDUSTRIAL PARTICIPATION PROGRAMME

INTRODUCTION

The National Industrial Participation (NIP) Programme, which is applicable to all government procurement contracts that have an imported content, became effective on the 1 September 1996. The NIP policy and guidelines were fully endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997. In terms of the Cabinet decision, all state and parastatal purchases / lease contracts (for goods, works and services) entered into after this date, are subject to the NIP requirements. NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. The Industrial Participation Secretariat (IPS) of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) is charged with the responsibility of administering the programme.

1 PILLARS OF THE PROGRAMME

- 1.1 The NIP obligation is benchmarked on the imported content of the contract. Any contract having an imported content equal to or exceeding US\$ 10 million or other currency equivalent to US\$ 10 million will have a NIP obligation. This threshold of US\$ 10 million can be reached as follows:
 - (a) Any single contract with imported content exceeding US\$10 million.
